We are specialist producers of Herbaceous Perennial Plants, growing two million plants annually in over 1600 varieties, as either field grown plants or in a range of container sizes, predominantly 9 cm or 2 Litre. Our main markets are other nurseries, garden centres, garden designers, landscapers and local authorities.

Howard Nurseries was founded fifty years ago and has steadily grown so that it now covers over 150 acres of land employing approximately 40 people plus seasonal staff as required.

As a wholesale nursery we are almost unique in the United Kingdom in offering an extensive range of field and container grown perennials. By propagating over 90% of our crops in house, we have control of quality and trueness to type. We have a good reputation for the generous size of our field grown plants. At all times we will strive to provide the best quality plants. We take great pride in our plants and to ensure they reach you in good condition we use our own transport and drivers where possible.

Of course, if a collection is made from the nursery this is always made to be beneficial to the customer. We accept payment by credit and debit cards, but we will be phasing out cheques and cash.

All plants are offered subject to availability at the point of call-off, e.g. advanced orders for spring can be affected by weather induced losses. We will not knowingly oversell but will contact you if orders seem to be lingering to free up stock in time if necessary. Orders are processed in order of receipt and an acknowledgement is emailed or posted as appropriate.

Deliveries

We deliver throughout the UK 12 months of the year and have varying transport options available to cater for all sizes of order.

Whether it's a small carrier delivery or a lorry full, our sales team review each order and will always work with you to find the most practical and costeffective delivery option based on your requirements and delivery timescale.



Acanthus ('Bears Breeches')

Architectural plant for hot sunny borders. D3-4

mollis – dark green pinnate foliage, tall spikes of prickly white and mauve flowers, 120-150cm, 7-9

 'Hollard's Gold' – broad shining golden yellow leaves especially pronounced in spring, mauve and white flower spikes on mature plants, 90cm, 6-9

spinosus – deeply segmented, dark shiny green leaves, impressive mauve spikes, 105cm, 7-9

Achillea ('Yarrow')

Best in sun and good drainage. For repeat flowering, cut back spent flower stems. D4-5

'Apfelblüte' (Galaxy Series) (Appleblossom) – two-tone pink as flowers mature, 50cm, 6-8

- 'Coronation Gold' true form, bright yellow, 90cm, 6-8
- 'Credo' good creamy yellow flowers, 100cm, 6-8
 - **'Fanal'** (The Beacon) strong red, fading as flowers mature, 60cm, 6-8

'Feuerland' – bright fiery red flowers with yellow eye, fading to burnt orange, sturdy, 75cm, 6-9

filipendulina 'Gold Plate' – large flat yellow heads held on tall stiff stems, 100cm, 6-8

(Forncett Series) 'Forncett Fletton' – two-tone brick orange, 75cm, 6-8

'Inca Gold' – terracotta orange flowers, 80cm, 6-8

Lachsschönheit' (Galaxy Series) (Salmon Beauty) – light salmon pink, 70cm, 6-8

'Martina' – large pale yellow flowers, 70cm, 6-10 millefolium 'Cerise Queen' – rosy cerise, 50cm, 6-8

- 'Red Velvet' red flowers which may darken to crimson, 60cm, 6-9
- 'Rose Madder' bright salmon-pink flowers, 60cm, 6-8
- **'Moonshine'** soft yellow heads, soft silvery foliage, 60cm, 6-8

nobilis subsp. neilreichii – greyish-green foliage, creamy-ivory flowers, 35-40cm, 7-8

'Paprika'(Galaxy Series) – scarlet-red flowers, fern-like feathery foliage, 70cm, 6-8

Summerwine' – clusters of deep claret flowers, slender stems, 70cm, 7-9


'Terracotta' – brown-orange maturing to pale yellow, 80cm, 6-9

'Walther Funcke' – orange-red flowers, 70cm, 6-8











Aconitum ('Monkshood')

An underrated plant with distinctive erect flower spikes for part shade or sun.

- CAUTION: Toxic if eaten/harmful via skin.
- **carmichaelii 'Arendsii'** upright spires of deep blue flowers and rich green divided foliage, 120cm, 7-8
- **'Newry Blue'** outstanding tall, narrow flower spikes, of rich, deep blue flowers adding a strong vertical to a border, 150cm, 7-9

Actaea ('Bugbane')

Actaea thrive in shade and partial shade, although they dislike boggy conditions.

They look wonderful at the back of borders and associate beautifully with ferns.

- 'Chocoholic' tall spikes of fragrant mauve-pink flowers that fade to white with age above contrasting deep purple foliage, 80cm, 8-9
- simplex 'Brunette' tall spikes of scented white bottle brush like flowers against contrasting dark purple foliage and dark stems, 150cm, 9-10
 - 'Pink Spike' fluffy white flowers open from pink buds on tall, slender stems above divided mahogany leaves, 150cm, 8-9

Agapanthus ('African Lily')

Increasingly popular for spectacular displays in sunny border or container. Attractive to butterflies especially white species. Flowers best in pot when restricted. D3-5

- 'African Queen' PBR striking white and blue flowers on deep purple stems, 70cm, 7-9
- 'Black Beauty' very dark violet-blue flowers with paler centres, ideal habit for the front of border or container, prefers full sun and a free draining soil, 60cm, 7-8
- **'Black Pantha'** PBR rounded umbels of dark violet-blue flowers on upright stems above broad, evergreen leaves, 60cm, 7-8
- **campanulatus** rounded umbels of blue flowers, clump forming, strong stems above narrow grey-green leaves, 60-120cm, 7-8
- - var. albidus graceful heads of white flowers, 60-75cm, 7-8
 - 'Cobalt Blue' violet-blue flowers, slightly darker base, anthers purple turning black, 80-120cm, 7-8
 - 'Gayle's Lilac' inside of flower very pale violet, margin pale violet, mid rib violet, anthers purple with yellow pollen, 50cm, 7-8
- **Headbourne hybrids** a selection of blue shades, 75cm, 7-8
 - **'Lilliput'** dark violet blue, anthers violet with yellowish pollen, deciduous leaves, 60cm, 7-8


- 'Midnight Star' ('Navy Blue') rather glossy, dark violet-blue, upright buds opening to very deep violet-blue flowers on long stems, 60-80cm, 7-8
- 'Queen Mum' PBR a beautiful new cultivar producing an abundance of extra large dual coloured white and blue flowers above dark green clumping foliage, 90-120cm, 7-8
- 'Sea Coral' palest white-blue, coral hints, 60-80cm, 7-8
- 'Streamline' violet blue flowers, small grass like leaves, dwarf habit, 45cm, 7-8
- **'Sandringham'** light violet-blue flowers on tall stems, contrasting with the mid-green leaves, 80cm, 7-8
- 'Torbay' free flowering with loose, sky blue heads, 60-75cm, 7-9
- **'Twister**' crystal white flutes turning inky blue at the tips, 60cm, 7-8
- white dwarf hybrids compact forms with heads full of white flowers, 50cm, 7-9
- 'White Heaven' PBR pure white trumpet shaped flowers, 90cm, 7-8


Agastache ('Giant Hyssop') Great for butterflies and sun! D3-4

- **'Blackadder'** upright lilac blue flowers, aniseed scent, 70-120cm, 7-10
- 'Firebird' intense aromatic grey foliage and short spikes of copper-red flowers, 60cm, 7-9
- **mexicana 'Red Fortune'** PBR spikes of coral and mulberry pink flowers, 60cm, 7-9
- **'Raspberry Summer'** PBR large, dark raspberry pink blooms above attractive aromatic, green foliage, 80-100cm, 6-10
- rugosa f.albiflora 'Liquorice White' large white flower spikes, aromatic leaves, 60cm, 7-9
- 'Golden Jubilee' blue flowers, unique golden foliage, 50cm, 6-10
- 'Liquorice Blue' large blue flower spikes, aromatic leaves, 60cm, 7-9
 - 'Alabaster' spikes of bottlebrush like white flowers above light green aromatic foliage, 90cm, 7-10
 - **'Summer Glow'** PBR apricot-yellow flower spikes, grey-green aromatic foliage, 60-70cm, 7-10
 - **'Summer Sunset**' spikes of warm orange flowers above dense green foliage, 60-70cm, 6-9
 - 'Tangerine Dreams' narrow spikes of soft tangerine flowers, grey-green leaves, 30-60cm, 6-9
 - **x Beelicious® Purple** PBR large purple flowers, compact bushy habit, 40-50cm, 7-10













Ageratina

Ideal for mid to back of border, giving structure and height. Loved by butterflies. Now listed under Eupatorium

Ajuga ('Bugle')

Excellent groundcover for moisture retentive, part shady, borders or containers. D5-6

reptans 'Black Scallop' PBR – bold, very dark purple foliage, blue flowers, 25cm, 4-6

 - 'Catlin's Giant' – large purple foliage, rich blue flowers, D4-5, 30cm, 5-6

Albuca

South African bulb. Sheltered, sunny and free draining positions. Good in pot. D7-8

- **shawii** stems of yellow bell-shaped flowers, scented, 45cm, 7-8
- Alchemilla ('Lady's Mantle')
 Hardly needs introducing! Brilliant for edging in sun or shade,
 will gently seed about. D4
- mollis sulphur yellow flowers and sculptured leaves which hold water droplets, 45cm, 6-8

Allium ('Decorative Onion')
Best in a well-drained soil and sun.
A magnet for butterflies & bees.

senescens subsp. glaucum – mauve flowers and rosettes of twisted prostrate leaves, good for front of border/rockery, D7-8, 20cm, 8

Alstroemeria ('Peruvian Lily')

Prefers moist conditions, making an impact in the midst of mixed borders

psittacina 'Royal Star' – branched clusters of dark red flowers over leaves with irregular cream edges, 80cm, 6-8

N.B. Look out for the extensive range of modern Alstroemeria hybrids on our Looking good/Availability Lists.

Amsonia ('Blue Star')

Easy and adaptable, for summer flowers and brilliant autumn colour. D4-5

tabernaemontana – clusters of light blue starry flowers, fine narrow leaves with a conspicuous pale green central vein, leaves turning yellow in autumn, 60-80cm, 5-8

Anaphalis ('Pearl Everlasting')
Useful groundcover in sun or part shade, especially if moist.
'Everlasting' flowers good for drying.
Repeat flowering when cut back hard after flowering. D3-4

triplinervis 'Sommerschnee' (Summer Snow) – silvery grey foliage, small bunched papery heads of white flowers, 25cm, 7-9

Anchusa ('Alkanet')

Richest blue flowers for a sunny position. Repeat flowers when cut back hard after flowering. D4

azurea 'Loddon Royalist' – the most popular variety, for good reason, bright blue, 90cm, 5-7

leptophylla incana – bright blue flowers with white eyes and loose rosettes of dark green leaves, 25cm, 5-8

 'Opal' – a rarely offered form, notable for its light Cambridge blue flowers, 90-120cm, 5-7

Anemone ('Windflower')

The Japanese Anemones are garden-worthy and long flowering at useful time of year.
For sun or part shade. D5-7

- hupehensis var. japonica 'Pamina' very symmetrical dainty deep pink double flowers, 50cm, 8-10
 - 'Praecox' single, dark pink flowers, 50cm, 8-10
 - x hybrida 'Andrea Atkinson' single, white, 70cm, 8-10
- 'Honorine Jobert' ('Alba') strong grower with large white flowers, 90cm, 8-10
- 'Königin Charlotte' (Queen Charlotte) semi-double, pink, 75cm, 8-10
 - 'Lady Gilmour' (hupehensis 'Crispa') unique heavily crested and fringed leaves, pink flowers, 60-100cm, 8-10
 - 'Richard Ahrens' semi-double, deep pink flowers, 100cm, 8-11
 - 'Robustissima' light pink flowers, vigorous, 60-120cm, 7-8
 - 'Whirlwind' semi-double, white, 80cm, 8-10
- multifida creamy yellow flowers followed by cottony seed heads, D7-8, 30cm, 5-6
- - 'Rubra' carmine red flowers, 30-40cm, 5-6
- sylvestris large white flowers followed by woolly seed heads, yellow centre, good ground cover, 30cm, 5-7



 - **atropurpurea** fine and noble plant, dark purple-red stems, handsome bipinnate foliage, emerging a rich claret-red and maturing to red-veined green, large umbels of white flowers, 150-180cm, 6-8
 - gigas showy, beetroot-red flowers on thick branched stems up to 200cm, 7-8

Anthemis

Ideal clump forming perennial for full sun. Cut back after flowering to encourage new growth. D3-4

- **tinctoria 'E.C. Buxton**' ferny green leaves, creamy-yellow flowers, 50cm, 6-11
- 'Wargrave Variety' large lemon-yellow flowers, 80cm, 7-8

Anthriscus ('Cow Parsley')

Suitable for flower meadows and wild gardens as well as a feature in borders

- sylvestris 'Ravenswing' purple bronze divided foliage, white flowers, 60cm, 6-8
- **Aquilegia** ('Columbine')

Another classic favourite. Gently seeds around in sun or part shade – very promiscuous so keep varieties apart to keep true to name! D5

- **Blue Star**' (Star Series) blue with creamy white centre, 100cm, 5-6
- **'Red Star'** (Star Series) red with creamy white centre, 100cm, 5-6
- var. stellata Barlow Series 'Black Barlow' double upright purple-black flowers, 80cm, 5-7
- - 'Blue Barlow' (Barlow Series) double upright violet-blue flowers, 80cm, 5-7
- -- 'Nora Barlow' (Barlow Series) double red flowers, pale green tips, 50cm, 5-7
- - 'Ruby Port' dark ruby, double, 70cm, 6-8
- 'William Guiness' unusual dark purple-black flowers with white trumpet, 60cm, 4-6
- **White Star'** (Star Series) White flowers with creamy yellow centres, 100cm, 5-6

Artemisia ('Wormwood')

Superb silver foliage for full sun. Trim in late spring if straggly. D3-4


absinthium 'Lambrook Mist' – soft, misty grey-green aromatic foliage, 75-100cm

lactiflora Guizhou Group – mahogany-brown stems, black-green foliage, creamy-white flowers, 120-180cm, 8-10

ludoviciana 'Silver Queen' – attractive silver-white foliage, free flowering, 100cm, 7-9

- 'Valerie Finnis' – very silver foliage, shorter in stature, 45-60cm

stelleriana 'Boughton Silver' – excellent silver foliage, short, spreading ground cover, yellowish flowers, 40cm, 8-9

Arum ('Snakeshead')

Tuberous perennials with arrow-head shaped leaves and tiny flowers at the base of a yellow or purple spadix, within a showy, hood-like spathe.

CAUTION: Toxic if eaten.

pictum – green leaves develop creamy-white veins during the winter months, followed by a purple-black spathe in the autumn, 30cm, 9-10

Aruncus ('Goat's Beard')

Very accommodating handsome plant for almost any soil or site, especially moist. D2-3

dioicus – stunning ivory plumes, 135cm, 6-7

Asclepias ('Milk Weed')

Tuberous perennial for sunny position. Exudes milky sap when cut. Plant 10cm deep in sandy soil. Loved by butterflies and bees. D4-6

tuberosa – unusual flower heads of brilliant orange, 45cm, 7-9

Asphodeline ('Jacob's Rod')
Dry open positions and sunny meadows. D4-6

lutea – rosettes of long grey-green leaves, tall, stiff spikes of fragrant bright yellow flowers, 90cm, 6-9

Asters ('Michaelmas Daisy')

Aster amellus

Excellent mildew resistant Asters for late summer colour. D4-5

'Brilliant' - bright pink, 75cm, 8-9

'King George' – ever popular violet blue, 60cm, 8-9

'Rosa Erfüllung' (Pink Zenith) – good clear pink, erect growth, 60cm, 8-9

Veilchenkönigin' (Violet Queen) – deep violet flower heads, 30cm, 8-10



An assortment of Asters nearly all requiring sun and well-drained soil. D5-6

- 'Aqua Compact' brilliant turquoise blue flowers with sunshine yellow centres and compact green foliage, 35cm, 9-10.
- **divaricatus** shiny black stems with star-like white flowers, 60cm, 8-9
- ericoides 'Pink Cloud' forms wide sprays, densely set with small starry pink flowers, D3-4, 90cm, 9-10
 - x frikartii light blue, 90cm, 8-10
- 'Mönch' lavender-blue, very long flowering period, 75cm. 7-10
- ▼ 'Wunder von Stäfa' bright lavender-blue, 70cm, 8-10
 - x herveyi (macrophyllus 'Twilight') violet flowers, large leaves, part shade, 70cm, 8-9
- ▼ lateriflorus var. horizontalis tiny foliage turning coppery purple by September, tiny pale white flushed pink flowers, 60cm, 8-9
 - 'Lady in Black' bright bronze-purple spring foliage maturing to dark purple-green, tall graceful flower stems with masses of white flowers, 100cm, 7-10

pyrenaeus 'Lutetia' – single, light lilac blue, 50cm, 8-9

All of our field grown production begins with propagation material sourced from our nursery. Propagation methods including, seed sowing, green cuttings, divisions & root cuttings are all used to achieve the perfect plant.

We begin field planting as soon as the weather and soil conditions are suitable and use both a module and disc planter to plant the wide range of field grown varieties that we have available.








We are passionate about the environment and are continually looking at new ways to reduce, re-use and recycle as much as we can.

We already generate a lot of our own energy with solar panels housed on our potting shed and catch and re-use all of the water that falls onto the nursery with our two on site reservoirs.

A lot of the cardboard packaging that is delivered into us is reused to package pallets where possible, the remainder is stored alongside the plastic bottles that are delivered and are then collected for recycling.

We wash and re-use our propagation trays annually and this year have started the transition to recyclable taupe pots. These are made from recycled plastic and are recyclable with kerbside collections by most councils. We are also continuing to reduce the amount of peat used in our compost, with all of our 2L lrises and grasses already being produced in 100% peat free compost.
